Distinguished Alumni Hall of Fame

The Hudsonville Hall of Fame honors individuals who have excelled in their professions, made meaningful contributions to their communities, or selflessly served Hudsonville Public Schools. Through these selections, the Hall of Fame celebrates a tradition of excellence, achievement, commitment, and dedication that inspires future generations.

This tradition began in 2017 and was further commemorated in 2023 with the installation of the Distinguished Alumni Hall of Fame at Hudsonville High School. Each year, new inductees are added to this permanent tribute.

The installation was made possible through a generous gift from the Wierda family in memory of their beloved wife and mother, Marcia Wierda. Marcia was a 1958 graduate of Hudsonville High School and a 2017 Distinguished Alumni Hall of Fame inductee.



LIEUTENANT COMMANDER LAUREN T. BAGULEY, USN

Class of 2010

CAREER ACHIEVEMENTS

From the pool to the bridge of a nuclear-powered aircraft carrier, Lieutenant Commander Lauren T. Baguley's journey has always been anchored in water. She began playing water polo in sixth grade and carried her love for the sport through high school, college, and beyond.

"Learning to swim in the environment that Hudsonville provided fostered my passion for the water while instilling lessons that shaped my future. The many hours spent in the pool honed my patience, discipline, and focus—qualities that continue to serve me in the Navy."

A 2014 graduate of the United States
Naval Academy, Commander Baguley
earned a Bachelor of Science in
Oceanography and received her
commission into the U.S. Navy. While at
the Academy, she was a four-year varsity
athlete and served as Team Captain of the
Women's Swimming Team. She later
earned a Master of Science in Operational
Meteorology and Oceanography from the

Naval Postgraduate School. Her postgraduate athletic achievements include selection for the World Military Championship Swim Team, with a competitive history of top-ranked performances in backstroke and freestyle events.

Professionally, Commander Baguley has been recognized with numerous military honors, including the Navy and Marine Corps Commendation Medal. She has deployed with two Task Force Naval Special Warfare units and recently served as officer of the deck aboard the USS George Washington, overseeing tactical weapons systems and ship maneuvering. She humbly credits the sailors and airmen she led for keeping operations running smoothly. In October 2025, she joined Vice Presidents and Members of Congress on a long list of prestigious awardees of the Ronald Reagan Peace Through Strength Award.

One standout moment in her career was navigating the George Washington through the Straits of Magellan—an unforgettable and intense experience. Collaborating with multiple South American nations to secure safe passage through regional waters was both a tactical and diplomatic exercise in international partnership.

Her formative years were shaped by Hudsonville educators who sparked her passions and resilience. She fondly remembers Mrs. Myrmel at Bauer Elementary, whose love of reading led Commander Baguley to one of her lifelong favorites, The Phantom Tollbooth (Juster, 1961). Mr. Marc Beemer inspired

DAVID DeJONGE

Class of 1987

CULTURAL & PERFORMING ARTS ACCOMPLISHMENTS

David DeJonge's journey reflects both extraordinary perseverance and uncommon vision. Although his academic path was challenged by ADHD, depression, and academic performance, David found belonging in the camera club, The Vantage Point, and the Pioneer staff. After attending Grand Rapids Community College, a career counselor encouraged him to pursue photography. It was a decision that became the foundation for a celebrated career in portraiture and photojournalism.

As a young photographer successfully building his clientele at David DeJonge Studio, he made portraits for some well-known people such as President Gerald Ford, Supreme Court Justice Scalia, President of South Africa F.W. De Klerk, House Speaker Newt Gingrich, President George W Bush, Jesse Jackson, New York Times best-selling author, Eric Metaxas, The Betsy DeVos Family, and Edsel Ford II.

DeJonge's passion for storytelling led him to create two major documentary projects

on veterans. The first was titled, "Michigan Veterans of Five Wars" which was co-authored by Karin Orr, the former columnist from the *Grand Rapids Press*. The two interviewed nearly 30 combat veterans from WWI to Desert Storm. The exhibition was featured in the VanAndel Museum and the State Capitol Rotunda.

The second project called DeJonge away from his family and business at a great financial sacrifice. It featured the last survivors of WWI. He interviewed and filmed survivors of America, Canada, Germany and England. President George W. Bush invited DeJonge and 108-year-old Frank Woodruff Buckles, the last surviving American WWI veteran, to the Oval Office for a press conference and an interview with the Today Show. Later that day they unveiled the portrait collection with the Joint Chiefs of Staff at the Pentagon.

After these visits they went to the DC WWI memorial on the National mall to find it in disrepair. Frank asked DeJonge to advocate for its restoration and to create a National one (this was the only memorial to WWI in DC and was to the 499 locals who lost their lives during the Great War). He pledged to fulfill that challenging wish and resulted in the DC WWI Memorial being restored, a new national WWI memorial, dedicated in 2021 in Pershing Park near the White House. And a third memorial in Kansas City also received the title of National WWI Museum and Memorial. DeJonge notes, "Being raised in Hudsonville with the values of our

DYLAN J. TAATJES, Ph.D Class of 1990

CAREER ACHIEVEMENTS

Dr. Dylan Taatjes has built a distinguished career at the intersection of biomedical research and academic leadership. After graduating from Hudsonville High School, he earned a B.S. in Chemistry from Calvin College and a Ph.D. in Organic Chemistry from the University of Colorado, Boulder. He completed postdoctoral research in Molecular and Structural Biology at the University of California, Berkeley.

As a graduate student, Dr. Taatjes studied two antitumor drugs commonly used in the clinic, doxorubicin and daunorubicin, and determined their mechanism of action, which had remained enigmatic for 20 years. He then designed and synthesized derivatives that were 10 to 10,000 times more effective than the parent compounds. During this time, Dr. Taatjes gained an interest in cancer biology, and he learned that many cancers are caused and propagated by defects in transcription (a.k.a. gene expression), which refers to how the human genome is de-coded. As a postdoctoral researcher, he studied how transcription is controlled in

human cells and learned that many proteins that regulate transcription are therapeutic targets. His lab at UC-Boulder combines a variety of methods and technologies to discover fundamental mechanisms that control human gene expression, and how these mechanisms are disrupted in disease. To expand the research scope and impact, the Taatjes lab works with US-based pharmaceutical companies and academic labs from around the world. His discoveries have revealed mechanisms for switching genes on and off, offering new therapeutic strategies for specific cancer types, as well as for developmental and inflammatory diseases.

As a professor at the University of Colorado's Department of Biochemistry, Dr. Taatjes has taught and mentored students since 2004. His mentorship prepares students to become independent scientists who go on to lead biotech companies and academic research labs worldwide. Dr. Taatjes also finds deep fulfillment in service to the scientific community, offering peer review for scientific journals, organizing international conferences, serving on NIH and NSF study sections, participating on editorial boards, and leading science outreach in local high schools.

Dr. Taatjes credits beloved Hudsonville educators, including Bill VanKoughnet, Marinus "Moss" Luttikhuizen, David Bolhuis, Larry Byle, Lyne Burkey, and Sue Topp, with sparking the curiosity and tenacity that launched his scientific path.

He lives in Boulder, Colorado with his wife, Jessica (Kahn), and enjoys running, hiking, golf, reading, and (of course) science.

perseverance beyond academic setbacks and brought history to life through immersive simulations. And Mrs. Lauren (Munoz) Jenkins, her Spanish teacher, provided the language and cultural skills that later helped Commander Baguley navigate diverse countries during deployment.

Today, Commander Baguley resides in Bremerton, Washington, where she enjoys swimming, reading, and sunny adventures with her dog, Finley. Whether coaching or supporting water polo programs, her dedication to the water—and the values it instilled in her—remains steadfast.

community, combined with my career path, compelled me to stand for those who could not stand for themselves."

Of his days with Hudsonville Public Schools, DeJonge recalls Mr. John Burgraaf as one of the most influential people of his younger years. Burgraaf's faith in DeJonge encouraged him through his struggles. Mr. Slotegraaf introduced DeJonge to German class and his first link to photography in the camera club. He credits Mr. David Bolhuis's list of "indications of maturing" as foundational and DeJonge aspired towards them.

Today, DeJonge is the proprietor of Legacy Icons in Zeeland, a company creating Christian worship goods. He and his wife Gayle have four grown children. His oldest son is in seminary learning Arabic in Lebanon, his next son is finishing his bachelor's and deciding between business and the priesthood, their daughter serves as an evangelical missionary, and the youngest son is preparing for his role in the family business. He considers his family and the fulfillment of Frank Buckles's dream among his greatest accomplishments, and attributes it all to divine guidance.
